Pastor's Corner

Turning to God

Drums

(Twenty-first in a series on connecting with God in the ordinary)

"The drummer worked us up to a fever pitch. Hallelujahs were heard everywhere. We could easily have stepped over the threshold into heaven and shaken hands with the angels."

Drums can do that for us—take us to the threshold of heaven. We're still in the Christmas season with its story of the angels singing in celebration of Jesus' birth. I'm imagining a heavenly drum corps accompanying them as they sing their joy. I have in my mind again one of the most distinctive of all Christmas songs, one that grabbed and has hung onto me from the time I was a child—"The Little Drummer Boy".

"The ox and lamb kept time, pa rum pum pum pum, I played my drum for Him, pa rum pum pum pum, I played my best for Him, pa rum pum pum pum, rum pum pum pum, rum pum pum pum. Then he smiled at me, pa rum pum pum pum, Me and my drum."

Drums have been used to praise and thus to connect us with God for ages. They're one of the oldest of all instruments and their beat is one of the most elemental of all sounds. The beating of our mother's heart is the first sound we hear. From our beginning the beat is there, instilled in us, and priming us for the power of the drumbeat to connect us with each other and with God.

Drummer Mickey Hart of the Grateful Dead was losing his grandmother to Alzheimer's. When nothing else could reach through her wall of isolation, Hart tried communicating with her through his drums. Her response was dramatic. Her focus, attention, energy, and memory increased. She came to life again as did many of the other patients in the home where she lived. Through the drums, they re-connected.

Hart, along with Dr. Oliver Sacks, the famed neurologist, and several other advisers, started a project called Rhythm for Life devoted to teaching therapists how to use percussion to reach patients with dementia and other conditions that otherwise keep them isolated and incommunicative. It works, says Hart, because drums and their beat speak to people at the deepest and highest levels.

I don't doubt it. Think of how everyone sits up, comes together, and starts to move when the drums begin to pound in the basketball gym, at the football

field, during the big parade, at the concert, on the dance floor, or in worship.

In 2010, let's not hesitate. Let's go ahead and drum with our fingers, tap with our feet, and get with the beat. Let's listen for the drums and let them carry us into the arms of God. Let's re-connect with our Maker through the elemental rhythm in our souls.

Esther Roege Memorial Enrichment Fund

At our congregation's Annual Meeting in 2003, we announced and made our first requests for contributions to the Esther Roege Memorial Enrichment Fund. This fund, in support of the continuing Christian education of our children and youth here at HCC and in memory of Esther, was generously established in 2002 with a \$15,000 gift from Esther's husband, Mr. William Roege. Mr. Roege himself died this past year and as we look forward to our 2010 Annual Meeting later this month, we especially want to remember both his benevolence to our church and Esther's honored place in our history.

For those of you who may not have known Esther, our former pastor, Bob Frederick, has provided the following reminiscence of her:

“Esther Roege was a member of the Haslett Community Church from December 1970 to her death in September 2001. A woman of strong faith, positive spirit, modesty and patience, she was at the heart of the church through nearly all the years of her church membership.

There was no responsibility or task that was either above or be-

low Esther's doing. She could always be counted on to help in small ways and in large. Esther headed the financial drive for the church building and renovation project in the 1970's. She also became the first woman moderator of the church in 1979 and 1980.

One of her true loves was teaching children. She saw them as both the present and the future of the church. The words of Jesus: “Let the children come to me...” were taken very personally by Esther.

Her husband, Bill, has provided a most generous gift to establish this permanent fund to enrich programs and opportunities for children and youth.”

By all accounts, Esther Roege was a major pillar of support to the ministry of our church for many, many years. In support of her particular concern for the Christian education of our children and youth, we once again encourage your donations to this fund set up in her cherished memory.

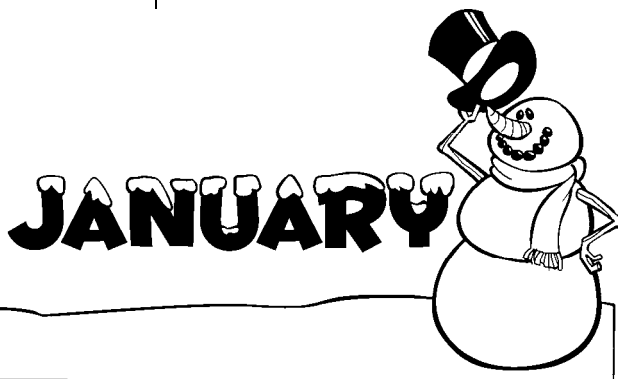

Haslett Community Church Committee/Ministry Team Descriptions

Church Council- Our By-laws give the Church Council general responsibility for all aspects of our church's program, property, and life. The Council is currently made up of two officers, our Moderator and Clerk, representatives from various ministry committees and teams and one at-large member.

Children's Ministry Team- Provides programming in support of the Christian education and nurture of our church's nursery and pre-school through 5th grade children and their families, especially through Sunday morning's Godly Play and Kingdom Makers Workshop activities.

Church and Society Committee- Provides opportunities for us to consider and act upon larger social issues in the light of our Christian faith. Has made and continues to nurture our congregation's connection to and support of Rose Gakwandi's Beloved Child Association in its ministry to Rwandan children orphaned by genocide and AIDS.

Church Growth Committee- Works to invite newcomers to our church and to make our congregational environment welcoming and hospitable to them.

Financial Stewardship Committee- Promotes financial commitment to our church and its programs through its leadership of our annual stewardship pledge campaign. It also leads in developing, presenting, and monitoring our annual budget.

Member Caring Committee- Extends personal care to the members of our church, especially in times of illness, grief, or other special need or crisis. Providing rides to worship, meals at times of illness, and receptions after funeral or memorial services are among its regular activities.

Mission Outreach Committee- Reaches out in direct service to our local community through, e.g., our Food bank, Personal Needs Closet, Children's Clothing Closet, and Christmas Giving Project. Promotes wider outreach by leading our participation in the United Church of Christ's national and international mission programs such as the CROP Walk, Our Church's Wider Mission, and One Great Hour of Sharing.

Property Committee- Maintains and further develops our church property, both buildings and grounds. Recruits volunteers for special work projects and leads the congregation in our annual fall and spring cleanup days.

Social Committee- Helps members and friends of the church develop a greater sense of belonging by providing regular activities for socializing and fun such as the Chicken Barbecue, Thanksgiving Dinner, Hanging of the Greens, Ski Trip, Adult Game Nights, Road Rally, Women and Girls' Brunch, summer Softball Team, and Family Camping Weekend.

Spiritual Life Committee- Serves to support and develop the worship activities of our congregation and offers program opportunities outside of worship designed to nurture the spiritual growth of adults. Among the latter in this coming year are Wisdom Heart, Bible Study, Religion and Science, The Power of Forgiveness, Practicing Our Faith, PeaceCircle, and the Men's Group.

Youth Ministry Team- Provides Middle School Sunday School and Middle School and High School youth activities designed to involve our young people in all five basic areas of our congregation's life: worship, faith exploration, ministry within the church, service to our wider church and communities, and fellowship. Regular youth group meetings, our confirmation program, and the annual summer mission trip are key elements in the Youth Ministry Team's work.

JINGLE BELL TAMBOURINE

To ring in 2010, make a joyful noise with this musical instrument.

What you need:

- 2 plastic plates
- Hole punch
- Pen
- Beads or beans (or other small items that will make noise when shaken)
- Tacky craft glue
- 6 pieces of ribbon (each about 5" long and 1/4" wide)
- 6 jingle bells
- Stickers
- Markers



What you do:

1. On the bottom of each plate, write, "Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth" (Psalm 100:1, NIV).
2. Punch six evenly spaced holes around the rim of one plate. Mark the holes with a pen and then punch six matching holes in the second plate.
3. Pour the beads or beans into one plate and then squeeze glue around the rim of that plate.
4. Place the other plate on top, aligning the holes. (Make sure the Bible verses are on the outside.) Let it dry.
5. Thread one ribbon through one hole and through one bell, and then tie the ribbon. Repeat five more times, once for each hole.
6. Decorate the instrument with stickers or markers.
7. Play your tambourine when you sing your favorite songs.
