

The Power of Myth (Joseph Campbell) interview with Bill Moyers

- led by Don Flagg

Don will start by sharing his journey with Joseph Campbell in print and PBS programming (5-10 minutes), followed by an introduction of the video series on PBS, then an introduction of symbolism(s) and myth.
