In 2014 we created a new way that we could organize all the opportunities folks have to serve HCC on Sunday mornings. We created the **Happy Heart** team- the greeters, ushers, Scripture readers, sound techs, coffee hosts and tellers who are so vitally important to our Sunday morning worship services.

The idea behind **Happy Heart**, is that when we serve others, not only are our own hearts filled with joy, but we also make happy the hearts of those we serve, and as a result, they make happy the hearts of those around them as well- the joy ripples outward into our community.

Folks were invited to indicate which roles they would be happy to serve in on Sunday mornings and a year-long calendar was created. If you were assigned a date that did not work for you, switching with someone else on the list was easy to do - you had a whole list of folks in front of you who you could call or email to easily switch Sundays (this helped lighten the load of our office staff). This easy-to-use calendar replaced the overlooked, often left blank, dust collecting sign-up sheets that hung in Friendship Hall.

After 9 years, especially post-pandemic, we've decided to have a **HAPPY HEART SUNDAY** to remember the reasoning behind it, to refresh some of the practices, and to RECRUIT new folks to join our **Happy Heart** Teams! At the start, we hoped no one would have to serve in any role more than TWICE per year. The more folks who sign up for each role, the closer we can get to that goal. ONCE per quarter in each role would be great.

What follows are descriptions of each of the **Happy Heart** roles. Even if you've served on the **Happy Heart** team for years, please take a minute to read through it as some of the roles have been refreshed or changed (in response to feedback we've received from volunteers and other changes).



Greeters: Our Greeters are the first to welcome folks into the building. They're encouraged to stand in Friendship Hall, near door #1 and the church office (this prevents too much of a bottle neck where the nametag table is now, near the sanctuary doors).



Ushers: Ushers distribute worship bulletins before the service. They also count everyone in attendance, as well as close/open the sanctuary doors. During the offering, they pass the offering plates and a basket for prayer requests, placing the offering plates on the communion table during the Doxology.



Scripture Reader: This person will do the first Scripture reading of the Service. The church office emails you the reading for the week so you are able to become familiar with it and practice it prior to Sunday morning.



Sound Techs:

These folks (usually 2 per Sunday) run the sound system. The people who work the system have been/ will be trained and are on a rotating schedule.



Coffee Hosts:

Coffee Hosts host our time of fellowship following the worship service. The coffee materials and instructions are posted in the kitchenette in Fellowship hall. Hosts are encouraged to arrive 45 minutes prior to worship to get the coffee started. Treats are not a requirement, but are enjoyed by the congregation when offered. Juice or punch (non-red) is nice for the children & non-coffee drinkers. There are also usually GLUTEN FREE options to use in the freezer in the HCC Main Kitchen.

Two recommended changes that we're making for our coffee hosts:

1. You can now **CHOOSE** which method of making coffee you are most comfortable with: brewers & air pots or the traditional percolators. Directions and supplies will be provided for both.
2. You can also **CHOOSE** whether to use one-time-use cups or washable mugs and cups.



Tellers: Tellers are specially-trained to count the offering. They are on a rotating schedule. If this is something you are interested in doing, and aren't already on the team, please contact Pastor Betsy or Pastor Erin.
