The day is surely coming when you will strengthen our hearts with humility and holiness.


We anticipate that day as we reach out to serve all of those in need.


- Take a "Purple Dove Cup" for your household on your way out it has some helpful info and a treat inside.

Written for John the Baptist's Day, June 24, this hymn clearly reflects the Isaiah text. Johannes Olearius, a Lutheran pastor, held a faculty appointment at Wittenberg University as well as church administration positions in his region.
