My name is Erin Heisler. I am the Minister for Youth and Children Programs here at Haslett Community Church (HCC). Ordained in 2009, I am very excited for my 15th year in ministry at HCC! I completed my undergrad at Central Michigan University where I studied Child Development as well as Religion. I then attended Princeton Theological Seminary and completed a Master of Divinity as well as a Master of Arts in Youth Ministry. I feel deeply called to the work I do with students. I like to support your students in all that they do: athletic teams, dance, clubs, musical endeavors, etc. Please share their sports, concert, recital schedules with me as you are able. I love to cheer them on in all they do, but I can't do it without your help.

Haslett Community Church belongs to the United Church of Christ (UCC) denomination. You can read more about our church in this packet. In the UCC, churches all express their beliefs in ways as different and unique as each of us. Our denomination believes there is no one way to be Christian, there is no one way to worship, nor is there one statement of faith that we all have to agree with. I think our youth group here at HCC is a beautiful expression of the UCC, in that our youth come from all different churches & backgrounds. If, as parents, you ever have questions about the beliefs being expressed at youth group, please come to me. We always try to make sure there is space for every side of each issue to be expressed; and with our varied backgrounds it makes for very rich discussions.

This truly is a family ministry, most of what you will see planned for this year is not possible without your support. Parent/guardian/adult help is essential to our ministry. From driving for events, helping with mission trip fundraisers, to being additional adults in the building during events, we can't do this ministry without you.

We share information about our program through weekly emails, snail mail, our Remind texting app and social media. Fill out the registration form online (QR code on the opposite page) to get plugged in so you don't miss anything!

I am excited for the year ahead and hope that you and your students are too!

SAFETY:

HCC is committed to being a Safe Church, one where our youth and children are protected. We have a Safe Church policy that outlines the procedures we follow to ensure we are creating the best possible environment for our youth and children. Copies of this policy will be provided for any family interested.

Our top priority is to provide an environment that is free from any physical, psychological, or sexual abuse or neglect.

Both Rev. Betsy Aho, Pastor, and I, Rev. Erin Heisler, Minister of Youth & Children, have undergone background checks and fingerprinting (re-certified September of 2021). Any volunteer in our program is asked to complete our Safe Church Training.

As outlined in the policy, we make every effort to have two adults at any and all youth ministry events. New this year, we created the position of “Youth Group Mentor,” which gives our HCC youth ministry alumni the opportunity to be the second adult at each youth group weekly meeting. These individuals will also complete Safe Church Training and undergo a background check.

I want you to know that your student’s physical and psychological safety and well being is always my top priority. Our greater community has had too many instances of individuals preying on our young people. My ministry is rooted in building relationships with them, but I do so only with the blessing of the student’s parent/guardian/adult. In addition to the Remind app, students often communicate with me through texting and social media, occasionally wanting to meet one on one. While I do hold everything they share with me confidential, if the health or safety of the student or another individual is a concern, I will share with the appropriate individuals (parent/guardian/adult, Rev. Betsy Aho, other authorities should the situation warrant). If you ever have a concern you are welcome to bring it to me or to Rev. Betsy Aho (phone: 517-339-8383 or email: aho.betsy@att.net)

One final thing, the events on this calendar are the official HCC sponsored youth ministry events. There are times that the youth organize gatherings themselves. I want you to know that I am rarely at the youth-organized events, nor do I even know that they are happening most of the time. It is wonderful that our youth love one another so much that they seek out other times to see and hang out together. I just wanted to be clear with parents that the events on this calendar are the only ones officially sponsored by the church and led by me.

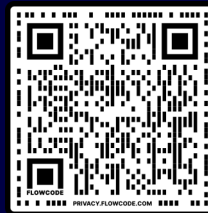

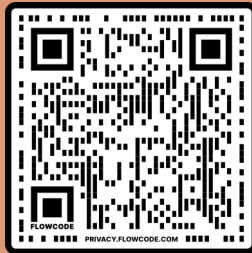

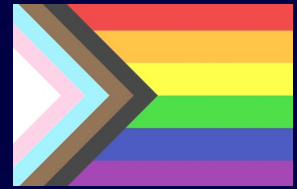

There has been a longstanding tradition at Haslett Community Church of high school youth serving on week-long summer mission trips. On these trips our youth and chaperones go all across the country, to cities near and far, to serve. These trips are filled with hard-work, but are also rich experiences where youth get to know people and places often very unlike the community they have grown up in. Each trip is very different; from the type of work that we do, to the places we stay and of course the people we meet, but one thing's for sure none of us return home the same.

Our mission trip tradition began in the summer of 1999 when 12 of us traveled down to Cedartown, Georgia. From that first trip, the congregation knew this was something that they would like to continue to support. A great deal of intentionality has gone into the mission trip tradition at HCC. Our staff, Youth Ministry Team (YMT), and the congregation all saw the great importance of serving communities both far away from Haslett, but also the ones in our own backyard. We are also committed to serving in the United States. We take seriously Jesus' call for disciples to serve to the ends of the earth, but we also are aware of the great need right here in our U.S. communities

Through these 27 trips, we estimate that we have sent over 730 participants over a total of 28,100 miles!

One final word about these trips. Our staff, Youth Ministry Team, and the congregation are all committed to keeping the cost low for families. These trips are incredible experiences where youth (and adults) not only learn about others, but they learn a great deal about themselves and they grow deeply in their faith. For that reason, HCC never wants cost to prohibit someone from going on the trip. We offer scholarships for youth (in any amount) so that each and every youth who feels called to serve on one of these trips has the opportunity. **BUT WE NEED YOUR HELP! We need ALL of our youth AND their families to help plan and work the fundraisers that these trips require!**



WHILE WE CAN'T YET SHARE THE DESTINATIONS FOR OUR 2024 MISSION TRIPS, WE ARE VERY EXCITED TO SHARE THAT OUR MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH WILL EACH HAVE THEIR OWN MISSION TRIP THIS SUMMER! THERE WERE SPECIAL PARTS OF HAVING THE GROUPS TRAVEL TOGETHER, BUT WE HOPE THAT MORE MIDDLE SCHOOLERS WILL FEEL EMPOWERED TO GO ON THIS YEAR'S SHORTER AND CLOSER TO HOME TRIP.

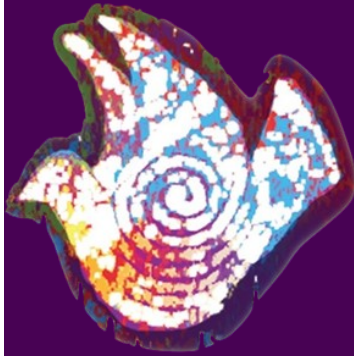

Does my student have to come every week?

NO! We know that students and their families are SO busy! Erin just wants students to know that they are welcome WHENEVER they can make it! We say that you're only a visitor once at our group, after that it's just as much your group as it is everyone else's, regardless of how often you attend!

Can my student bring a friend?

OF COURSE! Friends are ALWAYS welcome! For events that take place off-site (not at the church), it helps Erin to have a heads up so that we can be sure that we have the correct number of tickets or room in vehicles. If you know of a family that wants to get involved, feel free to share Erin's contact information or pass their information (emails, cell numbers) on to Erin so we can get them plugged in! Word of mouth is how we grow- so feel free to share about our group!

What does it cost to join?

NOTHING! There is no cost to be a part of our youth ministry. Some events that we do (like the haunted corn maze, laser tag, etc) have a cost, but we always communicate that well in advance. Our mission trips and weekend retreats also have a cost/participant as well. But we never want cost to prohibit someone from participating in anything that we do! Please communicate with Erin and we will cover the cost for your student, no questions asked.

What door should my student use when arriving at HCC?

All of our outer doors are numbered (1, 2 and 3). Students and families should plan on using door #1 (it is the door that is at the center of the building). Erin will send a Remind if a different door is in use for a particular event.

Can students drive themselves and/or friends for special events?

Our Safe Church Policy and our insurance company do not allow students to drive themselves and/or friends for special events. For any HCC event that requires transportation away from the church, all drivers must be over the age of 21 (so parent volunteers are ALWAYS appreciated).

Does Erin really have "favorites"?
