#### We welcome you to Worship with us!

Beginning Sunday, September 5, we will once again offer worship indoors in person in our Sanctuary! In the spirit of inclusivity and welcoming, we offer two additional ways for you to worship with us as well.

Three ways to worship with us:

- 1. <u>In the Sanctuary</u>! We are looking forward to throwing wide the doors. Here are some ways we are lowering risks as we gather inside to keep our community safer:
  - Currently, masks are required in the building, this includes during worship as we have young worshippers who cannot be vaccinated, and worshippers in higher risk categories.
  - Chairs will be spaced out, and you will be able to put an open seat holder on either side of your household to keep some distance.
  - Bulletins will be distributed, or you will have the option to access a digital version on your phone if you prefer.
  - An offering will be collected, but without passing the collection plates.
  - Music is one of the many important elements of worship at Haslett Community Church and will be part of our services. Congregational singing will take place outdoors after the service as part of our fellowship and coffee time. Masks are not required for outdoor activities.
  - Please worship remotely if you answer 'yes' to any of the questions on the health checklist **on page 3**.
- 2. <u>In the Parking Lot</u>! Want to be present at church, but you aren't quite ready to come inside? Join us in the parking lot!
  - Park near the sanctuary (south side is best) and turn your FM radio to 88.7
  - From the comfort of your car, you will hear everything that our sound system picks up.
- 3. <u>Remotely</u>! Continue to find the service each Sunday morning at <u>haslettcommunitychurch.org</u> or on our <u>YouTube channel</u> or <u>Facebook page</u>. Bulletins/Orders of Worship will also be available on the website and in video descriptions.
  - Enjoy the service wherever you are. And if you want to worship while wearing bunny slippers and sipping cocoa with too much whipped cream, no one will know!



#### Outdoor Worship at Lake Lansing Park North on Sunday, August 29

It has been a tradition at Haslett Community Church to enjoy an Outdoor Worship Service at Lake Lansing Park North. We look forward to continuing that tradition in August!

We will meet at Lake Lansing Park North at 10:00 am on Sunday, August 29, in

the **Main Shelter** (This is different than last year; it's the shelter we've traditionally been in), which can be found by going straight, then left after the entrance fee gate.

Light refreshments will be provided by Spiritual Life following the service.

Please bring a lawn chair if possible.

<u>There is an entrance fee</u> for Lake Lansing Park North...\$3 for Ingham county residents, \$5 for nonresidents. Annual passes are also available. **If you are unable to pay this fee, there is a hardship pass** that can be filled out at the entrance gate, allowing you to enter without paying the fee.

# SIDEWALK SUNDAY SCHOOL

This fall, in an effort to keep our preschool-5<sup>th</sup> graders as safe as possible, we will be having SIDEWALK SUNDAY SCHOOL!

Here's how Sundays will look for our preschool-5<sup>th</sup> graders:

- Children will begin in worship.
- When there is a Children's Moment, children will be able to participate from excatly where they are - we won't be gathering on the front sanctuary steps yet.
- Following the Children's Moment or the Passing of the Peace, preschool through 5<sup>th</sup> graders will leave worship.
- On weeks the weather allows, we will head outside (out the north door #2).
- We will gather, masked, on the sidewalk for a Bible story and activity (craft or game).
- When weather doesn't allow for outside, children will gather, spaced out in Friendship Hall for their Sunday school time.
- Following worship, families will be asked to meet us at door 2 to "pick up" the students before heading outdoors for coffee hour. Adult pick up helps ensure that all of

- our children are safe outdoors, especially given our proximity to the parking lot.
- Students are welcome to bring a water bottle with them. We won't be eating together at this time.

# NURSERY

Families with young children (newborn-3 years old) are welcome to keep their young ones with them in the sanctuary for worship. We welcome them and all their joyful noises that they make! For families who are more comfortable, we will be bringing toys from our nursery into Fellowship Hall (the space "behind" our sanctuary, next to the kitchen). Families with young children are also welcome to be in this space so toddlers have more room to move and play. This space is equipped with speakers so you will still be able to hear every moment of the service!

We will use the three compartment sink in the kitchen for regular toy cleaning at the end of the service.

We ask that this space be reserved for children ages 0-3 only and that older children be in the sanctuary space, so that the toys in Fellowship Hall remain clean for our littlest ones.

If families would appreciate having a nursery volunteer or two in this space as well, please reach out to Pastor Erin! We want you to be able to worship!





Every year we choose a word to be our youth group word of the year. Past words have included hope and embody. After all we've been through over the past year and a half, it seemed impossible to choose just one word for the year ahead. So, without further ado, I share with you the TWO words that will be our words of the 2021-2022 school year:



The phrase "one another" is derived from the Greek word allelon which means "one another, each other; mutually, reciprocally." It occurs 100 times in the New Testament. Approximately 59 of those occurrences are specific commands teaching us how (and how not) to relate to one another.

So each week at youth group, we will spend time learning about all of the different ways we are called to treat (and how not to treat) one another!

Weekly Youth Group Meetings will begin on SUNDAY, SEPT. 12<sup>TH</sup>! Middle School (6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade) 5-6:30pm High School (9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade) 7-9pm

#### Safety remains our top priority, so the following guidelines will be in place:

1. We will be meeting in the youth room in our regular groups: Middle school (6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade) from 5-6:30pm. High school (9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade) from

High school (9"-12" grade) from 7-9pm.

2. When Ingham County is in the substantial or high risk range, everyone will be asked to mask. When our county moves back down to moderate or low risk, vaccinated high schoolers will be allowed to attend unmasked. The entire middle school group will remain masked until a vaccine is approved for the younger students.

3. For the time being there will be no food provided at youth group meetings, but students are welcome to bring their own snack, water bottles, etc.

A DETAILED calendar and a parent letter will be coming out specifically to youth families, so please watch the mail and your email inbox for this important information. We won't be sharing our usual year-long calendar, because we hope to add more of our favorite traditions as health risks decrease. We will share some important save the dates for special events and the 2022 mission trip(s) for all students!

Above all, please know that I am committed to thinking creatively for us to reconnect and maintain our close family-like feel, and to get back to our youth group normal! Call, text, or email me anytime.



By the October Newsletter we should have more specifics to share. The group is open to anyone exploring connection for the journey.



### A Note about UCC General Synod 2021

For being able to participate in our United Church of Christ General Synod 2021 July 11-18, A Heart-felt thank you

to Pastor Betsy and Church Council!

In mid-May of this year, I received an e-mail from Pastor Betsy wondering if I'd be interested in representing HCC at the UCC General Synod, the global gathering of the denomination that meets every two years. Valarie Kaur, the activist and author whose work our Coffee with Jesus group has studied this past year, was scheduled as the first keynote speaker at the event. I felt honored by the invitation and a little overwhelmed, and Betsy, in her usual way, gave me permission to get involved as the spirit led. Attending a Synod? What's that about? I could imagine, from my experience of other biennial congregational meetings in the past, the people, places, events, the sense of being together as Christfollower: called together for seeing the larger business of Christ's call in this time. But this, of course, is not a normal year. This Synod was all orchestrated in a virtual space. Those who designed and implemented this Synod are truly to be appreciated, for all was delivered with expertise, style and centered spirit. You can access many of the worship services and materials <u>HERE</u>.

The theme of the Synod, *Rooted in Love*, based on Psalm 1, was faithfully carried through in powerful, inspiring, beautifully artistic, and wellintegrated worship services highlighting many different worship styles and ethnic groups. That our denomination is inclusive, diverse, and seeking to ground our faith in active love was consistently apparent. The Rev. Phiwa Langeni, who many of us

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here at HCC had the delight of hearing as guest preacher on June 13, was one of the key designers of the

opening worship service, which included virtual choirs from across the denomination, including our sister church Edgewood United! And, speaking of music, I especially enjoyed *Rooted in Love* by Ken Medema, *Bring us Peace* by Michelle Hecht, and a favorite of the convention, *I'm Surrounded*, sung by the Rev. Mia McClain from the closing worship service. That service focused on breathing again, breathing through targeted issues, and highlighting how we can help those that can't.

Keynote speaker and activist Valarie Kaur challenged us with the questions: What if every congregation became a pocket of Revolutionary Love? ...What if we thought of every choice we make as a part of revolutionary love? If we joined others in this process? (Look up ValarieKaur.com for resources). The second Keynote speaker, Adam Russell Taylor, new president of Sojourners, spoke about the compelling world vision of the Beloved Community where all lives are valued, where the common good is key to actions and policies. He spoke of how racism and toxic polarization is undermining the beloved community and said "until we have a common understanding of our story, we'll be unable to unite around a common world view in which we cast out the belief that some lives are worth more than other lives."

Outside of worship together, Synod committees worked hard on many different areas of concern and passed many important resolutions providing suggested direction for our communities of faith. These included concerns for our environment, issues around equity, racism, and racial justice, and our callings as a 21<sup>st</sup> century church.

Once again, I am grateful to have experienced a sampling of the work, worship, and inspiration at Synod, and am grateful to be a part of a great cloud of witnesses, the beloved community which seeks to embody with growing revolutionary love "No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!"
