"What are you giving up for Lent?"

Sound familiar?

This is the month that Lent begins. Lent is the Christian season, beginning with Ash Wednesday and ending with the celebration of Easter Sunday, in

which believers try to simplify their lives and focus on turning away from temptation and toward God.

Part of that turning from temptation can come in the form of fasting, or "giving up" your favorite food. Hence the question, "What are you giving up for Lent?"

But reducing this Holy season to a glorified diet (no judgment; I've given up potato chips for Lent more than once!) can be a missed opportunity for self-reflection and deeper connection with God, self, others, and creation.

Rather than deciding what you're "giving up" for Lent, try asking yourself these questions:

- What practices can I engage in to enter more deeply into my relationship with God?
- What is cluttering up my life/mind/house that is keeping my faith stuck?
- Is there a topic that I could invest time in learning about that could increase my understanding and love for God/myself/others/creation?

Lent is understood as a rather somber season, or at least a contemplative one. It starts, after all, with a service that calls us to remember our own mortality, Ash Wednesday.

But I invite us to embrace Lent and all that it has to offer. We might even find that Lent can renew our spirits and deepen our faith.

You will see on <u>page 2</u> the ways you are invited to engage in our Lenten journey, including Lenten Journals (available in hard copy or digitally), ashes for pick-up (or we can drop them off), Ash Wednesday service via Zoom (accessible by home phone, smart phone, or computer), and a guest preacher to launch our Lenten Equity Challenge.

We have been apart for a very long time, dear ones. Might the season we are walking into this month connect us by the Spirit and the practices we engage in together. And if there is some way I can be of help to you, or you are feeling just a bit too disconnected from the church and could use some conversation and/or prayer, please reach out. It is always good to hear from you, the people who make up this wonderful community of faith.

LENT BEGINS with Ash Wednesday on February 17, and lasts until Easter Sunday on April 4, 2021.

Here are some ways we are engaging in our Lenten Journey from the beginning:

Pick up ashes and a Lenten journal for your household beginning on Saturday, February 13. The document holders in front of the church will



have containers with ashes for your household, and Lenten journals (if needed) available for pick-up. If you need items dropped off to you, just give the office a call and let us know; we would be happy to do



that. Add a couple drops of vegetable oil or olive oil to the ashes to ready them for Ash Wednesday. The study journals will also be emailed, but hard copies will be available for those who prefer. Study Journals are based on the 21-Day Racial Equity Challenge put out by the Michigan League for Public Policy. The emailed version will have some digital content not available in the hard copy, but both versions are robust in scope.

COVID19 Vaccine News:

Michigan is currently in Phase 1b of vaccine prioriti-

zation. In addition to all healthcare, frontline, and essential workers from critical infrastructure, Phase 1b also includes ANYONE AGE 65 AND OVER. Currently, the supply does not meet the demand, but if eligible, you are encouraged to register to be notified when there is an appointment available. This can take persistence. Much of the registration is being done online through your county's health department, or through Sparrow Hospital, but you can also call your doctor to inquire, or call your pharmacy. Meijer is accepting registrations for the public, and this can be done by phone. Do not hesitate to be put on more than one list. If you get an appointment through one source, you simply turn down the appointments elsewhere when called. The vaccines available require 2 doses to be effective; once you get the first shot, you will be able to schedule your second one.



Michigan Conference Minister Search Begins

Pastor Betsy is proud to be representing the Covenant Association on the search committee for the permanent Conference Minister of the Michigan Conference of the United Church of Christ. Rev. Dr. Campbell Lovett retired in January 2020, and the conference has been served by Transitional Conference Minister, Rev. Phil Hart. The search for the next Conference Minister is expected to take approximately 18 months, with some background work beginning promptly. The Search Committee is made up of people from around the state, ordained and lay members, and the committee will be guided by a staff member at the National Setting with experience in this work.


