Greetings, Haslett Community Church! There is so much to celebrate together.

Our summer concert series is fully planned (<u>see page 5</u>) with wonderful, local musicians. We are planning several

in-person worship services with real, live coffee fellowship throughout the summer (see page 2). We will induct several households into membership of Haslett Community Church during our July worship service. Vacation Bible School is going full steam ahead so our kiddos might know they are loved by God unconditionally. By your generosity, our church continues to be financially healthy with your regular giving, and the Flowers & Foundations campaign, which exceeded its goal by \$5,000, is allowing south side improvements to continue. The old tile sewer line has been replaced with a modern pipe, and, as I type this, preparations are being made for the retaining wall on the south side. The new bike rack was also delivered this week and will be installed this summer. Our building is opening up more and more (see page 6), and we have a firm date to be back in worship with one another with no preregistration or attendance restrictions anticipated: September 5. We will be using the summer to prepare the building and property to welcome everyone back, while continuing to improve accessibility for those who have begun worshiping from a distance or choose to remain remote.

That is a lot of progress and planning to celebrate!

However, I recognize that many will be surprised to see we aren't returning to weekly, indoor, in-person worship sooner. My heart aches to be together, please know that. I recognize that this cautious approach will not be embraced by everyone. Our hope and prayer is that by waiting until fall, vaccination rates will be high enough and community spread low enough, that church will be a safe place for everyone. We want to

care for the vulnerable and the children and make them feel welcome (while also respecting those who choose to remain remote). We do not want to have to take reservations for church or keep visitors at bay. And we want the building and grounds to be ready for everyone.

We have come so far. We are so close. Outdoor, in-person opportunities abound this summer, which I hope will fill some needs. That being said, I know this is hard. While keeping many as physically safe as possible, there are spiritual and emotional health considerations to make. I do not take those lightly, and I know we have some healing to do as individuals, as a church, and as a world.

Dear ones, we are moving toward being together again in ways that are known to you. But that return will not be "normal," because we have traveled through too much together for that. I imagine we will enter our Sanctuary with a new reverence, some new sorrows, and overcome with a new appreciation for the gift of community and gathering.

I am full of gratitude for your perseverance and faith. You are wholly and dearly loved.

In their free time, Phiwa enjoys reading, upcycling, 90s R&B, dad jokes, and creating all manner of things.

Interviewees will be both congregation and community members. Each of these primary questions/themes will guide the interviews for two




