And I am going to try to be equally thankful, in the moments where I feel out of sorts or downhearted, that I have a church, a God and a community that can be strong for me when needed. COVID-19 in Ingham County and Michigan

I think we can all agree that COVID precautions are exhausting! Fear

not - there are signs of hope: vaccines recently approved for children ages 5-11, and encouraging national trends! However, Ingham County (and our state as a whole) is trending up in all of the markers for COVID: hospitalizations, incidence curve, and percent positive cases. Some have asked why we are still masked in worship and in the building,

why we are having coffee fellowship outside, and when things will return to pre-pandemic normal. The graphs on page 3 (up-to-date as of October 19, 2021) are offered to show a visual snapshot of why we are still taking precautions. But we move forward in hope.

Please get vaccinated against COVID19 when you are eligible. Please get a booster if you are eligible. Please stay home if you do not feel well (Refer to our COVID-19 Health Questionnaire on pg. 11 before attending any in-person events), and we will get through this together, by God's grace.





Playdough, birthday candles and a tea light.




For this one, the wreath is made of cut-out handprints on green paper and colored toilet paper tubes. I would recommend battery operated tea lights for safety.

Loaves and Fishes Ministries offers overnight shelter to guests in a comfortable, safe and home-like environment. They have space to house 6 men and 4 women every night. Guests are welcome to stay at Loaves and Fishes up to 30 nights.

Haslett Community Church provides the evening meal for the guests once a month. This ministry has been a part of the church for approximately 20 years. There are four parts to the meal; a main course, a vegetable, a salad and a dessert. The meal serves 15 people.

If you would like to volunteer and help provide the meal, please send an email to Nancy White at nancylwhite@comcast.net, and Nancy will add you to the list. Nancy sends out the sign-up sheet and communicates with the respondents.

Paula Fry coordinates the collection of the food and delivers the meal to the shelter.

Parking Lot Re-Surface!

The parking lot has been taken down to its base and completely resurfaced! This much needed

change makes the whole property look more inviting, well kept, and ready to welcome one and all.

Last month, the newsletter stated that the parking lot resurface would be paid for with a combination of a line-of-credit from the UCC Cornerstone Fund, and using some of our available fund balance. At the last Council meeting, it was instead decided to use a combination of the line-of-credit (\$40,000) and a portion of the memorial funds (\$18,000) rather than the fund balance to pay for the project, so as to not bring our fund balance down too low. We wanted to make the congregation aware of the change. This is a great example of the kinds of work that can be done thanks to memorial gifts!

Volunteers also spread mulch around where it was needed so the property is really looking wonderful! Stop by and see for yourself sometime if you haven't yet, and thank you for your generosity to Haslett Community Church!






Christmas Giving Project 2021 - Gifts

The 2021 Christmas Giving Project will operate very similar to 2020 so that it is safe and easy for everyone

to contribute and participate. You, your family and friends are invited to purchase gifts.

WHAT: The project offers five gifts to each child. Donors will receive a gift list that shows all gifts for a single child. We ask one person to register for the child even if you decide to share the gift purchasing for that child with a family member or friend. You can select any number of children.

HOW: You can make a request remotely by sending an email with Gift Request in the Subject line to: hccChristmas@att.net

Put three things in your email:

- 1) your name and phone number
- 2) **list the number of children** you wish to purchase gifts for (remember, you will be responsible for five gifts for each child you request)
- Tell us your preference of the child's age:
 0 to 5 years old; 6 to 12 years old; or
 13 to 18 years old. You can include a gender preference, but that is not required.

You will receive a gift list and gift preparation instructions via return email. We will do our best to match your request. The gift lists will be sent out beginning November 14.

You can also pick up a gift list from the gift table in Friendship Hall Sunday morning after worship beginning November 14, or Saturday morning just inside Door #1 (west side of building).

We welcome you to Worship with us!

In the spirit of inclusivity and welcoming, we offer three ways for you to worship with us:



- 1. <u>In person in the Sanctuary</u> There are some ways we are lowering risks as we gather inside to keep our community safer:
 - Currently, masks are required in the building, this includes during worship as we have young worshippers who cannot be vaccinated, and worshippers in higher risk categories.
 - Chairs are spaced out, and you can put an open seat holder on either side of your household to keep some distance.
 - Bulletins are distributed on paper and electronically if you prefer.
 - Music is one of the many important elements of worship at Haslett Community Church and will be part of our services. At this point, that doesn't include in person Congregational singing
 - Please worship remotely if you answer 'yes' to any of the questions on the health checklist below.
- 1. <u>In the Parking Lot via radio</u> Want to be present at church, but you aren't quite ready to come inside? Join us in the parking lot!
