

We welcome you to Worship with us!

In the spirit of inclusivity and welcoming, we offer three ways for you to worship with us:

1. In person in the Sanctuary There are some ways we are lowering risks as we gather inside to keep our community safer:

- Currently, masks are required in the building, this includes during worship as we have young worshippers who cannot be vaccinated, and worshippers in higher risk categories.
- Chairs are spaced out, and you can put an open seat holder on either side of your household to keep some distance.
- · Bulletins are distributed, or you have the option to access a digital version on your phone if you prefer.
- An offering is collected, but without passing the collection plates.
- Music is one of the many important elements of worship at Haslett Community Church and will be part of our services. At this point, Congregational singing only takes place outdoors sometimes after the service as part of our fellowship and coffee time. Masks are not required for outdoor activities.
- Please worship remotely if you answer 'yes' to any of the questions on the health checklist below.
- 2. In the Parking Lot via radio Want to be present at church, but you aren't quite ready to come inside? Join us in the parking lot!
 - Park near the sanctuary (south side is best), turn your radio to 88.7 FM, and turn up the volume. From the comfort of your car, you will hear everything that our sound system picks up, and we can wave to you from the sanctuary! You can find the bulletin online HERE.
- 3. Remote via Livestream Continue to find the service each Sunday morning at haslettcommunitychurch.org or on our YouTube channel. You can find the bulletin online HERE.
 - Enjoy the service wherever you are. And if you want to worship while wearing bunny slippers and sipping cocoa with too much whipped cream, no one will know!

Parking Lot Re-Surface!

Financed through a combination of our available fund balance and a line of credit from the UCC Cornerstone Fund, the church parking lot resurface began Thursday, September 30° and will take about 5 business days to complete.

The lot will be available for use on Sunday, October 3, to park for church and coffee fellowship. Please note that there will be gravel and stones on the surface over the weekend so please drive with caution.

If you prefer a finished surface, you may park on Tonawanda or Monterey streets in the neighborhood to the south of the church, being careful to respect driveways, etc. Work is expected to conclude by Wednesday, October 6. When the lot is inaccessible during the construction, we will post signs. We will also post updates on our Facebook page, website, and voicemail message.



Local interfaith group bringing solar power to south Lansing community center

At a time when divisiveness and conflict are often in the news, several Lansing area

religious congregations are working together for a good cause.

The Capital Area Chapter of Michigan Interfaith Power and Light is raising \$35,000 to put solar energy panels on the roof of the South Side Community Coalition (SSCC) Center in south Lansing, which provides programs and services for low-income minority children, youth, and families. When completed in early 2022, the solar panels will provide all of the center's electricity, saving thousands of dollars annually.

The cost savings will support the SSCC's programs and services for children (education and recreation), teens (life-skill-building programs, a computer lab, and health care outreach), and senior citizens (health care, nutritional support, and social programs).

Currently, the interfaith group has raised approximately \$20,000 of the needed \$35,000 from its member houses of worship and community supporters. There will be a reception next week at the SSCC Center to thank organizations and individuals who have already donated to the project and to provide information to others who may be interested in donating:
