#### Palm Sunday · April 2 · 10 a.m.:

Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem to cheering and honor by the crowds who welcome him and lay palms along his path. We celebrate with a family friendly Palm Parade and Blessing of the Palms!

Scripture: Matthew 20: 29-21:17



We set the table to remember when Jesus shared a special meal with his disciples on the night he was arrested. The last supper is the convocation of



what we know and celebrate as Holy Communion. This service will put communion at its center as we remember Jesus' invitation to the table. Scripture: Matthew 26: 17-30 (Communion elements are gluten-free and alcohol free)

Good Friday · April 7 · 7 p.m.: We remember the crucifixion of Jesus. We remember that Jesus took violence and evil to the cross with him so that humanity might know reconciliation and love. this night ends with sacrifice but the story does not end there. There is yet hope. Scripture: Matthew 27: 27-61

Easter Sunrise · April 9 · 7:30 a.m.: Connecting the waiting and mystery of Holy Saturday with the joy of Easter Sunday. We light a fire outside, and lighted candles are brought into the sanctuary for song, prayer, communion and the joy of the resurrection! Scripture: Matthew 28: 1-11

Easter Sunday · April 9 · 10 a.m.: Celebrate the empty tomb and the resurrection of Jesus Christ! We learn again that we worship a God of hope, life, love and promises fulfilled! You can add a flower to the cross outside, enjoy a Sanctuary full of spring blooms, and participate in a joy filled service that includes favorite Easter hymns, meaningful prayers, scripture and preaching, and a children's message for our young worshipers! Thursday, April 6<sup>th</sup> is MAUNDY THURSDAY




Friday, April 7<sup>th</sup> is GOOD FRIDAY

We are finalizing plans for our 2023 mission trip to Nashville! We have 8 middle schoolers, 17 high schoolers, and 8 chaperones (3 of whom are HCC alumni) looking forward to serving the people of Nashville.

We are again partnering with Service Learning Camps (they organized our Milwaukee worksites last summer). Our mission coordinator, Brady Banks, is hard at work planning what organizations we will be partnering with for our work.

Here are four of the organizations we will work with in Nashville (their logos link to their websites):



Grace Works knows that local lowincome residents have diverse needs – food, clothing, housing support, and financial assistance – yet, most area nonprofits/churches focus on only one or two services. By pooling resources, Grace Works has been able to offer wraparound services to a large number of individuals and families in need!



Dream Streets' mission is to protect and empower individuals living in distress. They provide supplemental groceries & familystrengthening tools; including classes, connection and employment for single mothers, programs for children & teens to learn Biblical stories and values, as well as opportunities for mentorship, character development and life skills. They also offer a job-readiness program preparing individuals to go into the culinary arts and a grant program to help individuals become home owners.

# Æ FEED AMERICA FIRST

Feed America First's mission is to provide food to those who feed the hungry. They do so through saving food on a large scale from manufacturers, distributors, farms and stores; rescuing up to 4 million pounds of fresh food every month! They supply this rescued food to over 200 food pantries across the region, reaching over 40,000 families in need every month!

# SOLES 4

Soles4Souls turns shoes and clothing into opportunities for education & employment to build a more hopeful future through three specific programs (4Relief, 4Opportunity, 4EveryKid). 4Relief focuses on getting new shoes and clothing to people in crisis, freeing up financial resources that can then be used toward other needs, 40pportunity uses donated, gently worn shoes, to help individuals become entrepreneurs and start small businesses that help them climb out of poverty, while at the same time helping their communities (and the world by keeping 80 million pounds of textiles out of landfills). 4EveryKid focuses on

giving kids needed shoes. Many organizations focus on critical needs of food and shelter, but school officials continually report that shoes are also essential to helping students succeed in school. Kids who receive new shoes have more confidence, attend school more regularly and are more physically active.

We will be launching a new mission trip fundraiser in April. More information coming soon about how you can support this trip!










In celebration of Earth Day, the HCC Green Team is rolling out the Red Carpet.



#### **Property Committee Update**

April already?!?! Yes, spring is here! Last May the Property Committee began researching and collaborating with other HCC committees regarding the suggested removal of the church's eastside trees, specifically, the walnut nearest the garage and the maple nearest our drain systems.



After much deliberation, the Property Committee recommended to Council, and it was approved, to remove the trees. This work is scheduled to take place on April 26, dependent on weather.

First, we will remove the walnut tree due to its proximity to the children's playground area, the trip hazard associated with fallen walnuts in our northeast parking lot, and the upkeep required to avoid limbs falling on the playground and/or the garage roof. Unfortunately, the tree isn't straight enough to sell. More details to come.

Second, the removal of the maple tree, currently sporting an orange ribbon, is needed due to its proximity to the French Drain systems we have on the east side. The maple has also been a "highway" for the nuisance squirrels we have been dealing with on a regular basis, although, I believe that the HCC staff will miss the reduced sounds of their "pitter patting" above their heads in the office.

Third, because of the amount of tree work, and because the Property Committee and HCC leadership are already aware of some of the unsafe conditions of our beloved playground, we will be removing the playground equipment in the coming weeks. Rest assured, we will salvage what we can, sell what we can, and recycle what we can. As soon as a date is set, we will inform the membership. Please note, the Property Committee will be organizing new "future of the playground" discussions and/or group to help us decide how to move forward. The accessible playground grant we were hoping for was not approved at this time, but we hope to continue in our efforts to offer the community an accessible playground for all; more details to come this spring/summer.


