From Ann McGrath, Council Rep. for Social Committee:

"Just as people all over the world need food, water, and shelter, people also need a place to belong, a place to fit in, a community of support. HCC has always been a welcoming church and now has a vision that would encourage and develop this idea of a place for all to feel at home. The vision encompasses our own community, and hope for the world. This vision is ambitious, for it challenges the congregation to not only welcome, but purposefully work toward building a place where everyone will feel they fit in, and where they will experience a community of support and love."

Prior to voting on adopting the new Mission, Vision, and Values statements, Church Council was given a presentation that honor our current vision statement, explains the information and theological grounding of

the new statements, and shows how the whole congregation contributed to their formation! You have two opportunities to hear a similar presentation, and to be part of the big reveal to the whole congregation!

April 7, 2024, 10 a.m.: The Mission, Vision, and Values are presented within the context of worship; the "Big Reveal" will be part of the sermon.

April 14, 2024, 11:15 a.m.: If you cannot be in church on April 7, please come to the presentation after worship on April 14, so you know the story behind the formation of the mission, vision and values.

Welcome Rev. Lawrence T. Richardson, Associate Conference Minister for Transitions and Vitality on April 21!

Rev. Lawrence T. Richardson has been an ordained minister for 20 years. He has served as a new church start pastor, a local church pastor, a multi-staff church pastor, on national staff, in for-profit and nonprofit settings, and is a member of the United Church of Christ (UCC) national board of directors, where he chairs the Development Committee. Rev. Richardson is the Associate Conference Minister for Church Vitality and Transitions for the Michigan Conference UCC. He is a St. Catherine University and Liberty Seminary graduate and is a doctoral candidate at Berkeley School of Theology, where his focus is Christian Spirituality and Formation.
