Dear Haslett Community Church,

Perhaps the most impactful takeaway from General Synod 34, which Erin and I participated in at the beginning of July in Indianapolis, was the power, sense of belonging, and healing energy that gathering in community with God at the center can provide.

This isn't a new revelation. I know this from the community of Haslett Community Church, United Church of Christ. You know this, too. To quote excerpts of Michigan Conference Minister, Lillian Daniel's reflections of General Synod:

"The General Synod of our denomination is a fiery and feisty family reunion... We need each other, friends. Our struggles are not unique.

Many churches are looking at how best to work with part time clergy... Lately, too many of our Michigan Conference churches have had their welcoming Open and Affirming signs or pride flags vandalized.

We don't need to wait for a national biennial or triennial gathering to encourage each other.

Our own Michigan annual meeting is coming up October 28 in Grand Rapids, with a speaker to inspire us with real examples of church growth and partnership, and an opportunity to gather the night before just for casual conversation and connection in person. I didn't realize how much I had been missing that kind of thing until I got it at General Synod, and I realized we can do a lot more of that here in Michigan, with better weather..."


Come Watch: "Apollo 11"

You may have noticed a new candle holder appear on the Communion Table in early May. This beautiful piece was commissioned and donated by long-time church member, Malinda Barr and her husband Dave. The symbolism behind this piece is extraordinary.

This candelabra was created by Jon Boza of Broken Brain Woodworking in Williamston, MI. Mr. Boza is a recent stroke survivor. During and after his recovery he learned much about himself, through loss of skills to gaining of new talents. While physically he recovered well from the stroke, his memory hasn't been the same. Once a master mechanic, he no longer can remember how he did

things or recreate them. Despite his previous skills being taken from him, he has persevered and honed new talents. Jon is able to take what he sees



in his mind and bring it to life. He takes great pride in restoring wood from antique pianos and organs, breathing new life into it with the art he creates. He credits his higher power for this inspiration.

In the summer of 2022, Dave and Malinda met Mr. Boza at the Williamston Farmers Market and were immediately drawn to his art. Given that HCC's previous candelabra had been broken since before the pandemic, it was crystal clear to them that

Mr. Boza was the perfect choice to create a beau-tiful, symbolic piece of art to replace it. The main wood used in the new candelabra is from a 1920's piano. The three pillars that hold the candles are built in denominations of 3, representing the Holy Trinity. The cross insert is called "Purple Heart" wood and is the only wood not from the piano. This was chosen specifically to represent the HCC signature color, purple.

Beyond Beauty: Native Plants are Valuable to the Ecosystem

When I see a flower blooming around the church, I frequently find myself saying, "That's so beautiful." And I am often gently reminded that when it comes to native plants, there is a deeper purpose than beauty. Native plants help foster and sustain the ecosystem by providing sustenance and shelter to local pollinators, birds, and more, and some are even host to butterfly larva. There is beauty in the purpose of native plants that runs deeper than their appearance.

As some of the traditional plants that were planted long ago die off, and as other more invasive species are removed,

Haslett Community Church grounds are increasingly becoming host to native plant species. This is a brief update on what is happening in the gardens around the church, followed by a new HCC Connections monthly feature, "What's Blooming," in which Sallay Garrod, who has been, and continues to be, instrumental in the move toward native plantings, will teach us a bit about one of the native plants you can find on the grounds of our church.

Garden Update:

South Side: The garden just outside the Sanctuary's south side is all planted with native plants. They were chosen in part because, while they will grow as they get established, they will not get too large. Keep watching and note the changes. There is some drainage work yet to be done near the south porch, so that area is still a work in progress. Also on the south side, just to the west of the parking lot entrance, is a prairie study being conducted by an MSU Student. What may look like "a bunch of weeds" is actually serving an educational purpose, and soon you will see signage and some marking of the study area.

West Side: The crown of the west side of the church is our Memorial Garden. It is full of native plants and is also a registered Monarch Waystation. Also on the west side are some raised beds, currently growing Zinnias (not native, but not invasive, and good pollinators), some shrubbery outside the sanctuary's south facing windows that need to be addressed in the future, and the lovely garden along the west wall of Friendship Hall. The latter, informally and lovingly referred to as "Mary (Nelson)'s Garden" is being nurtured so that as some of the original plants lose viability, they are replaced with native plants.

North Side: The north side of the grounds has the newly dedicated native plant pollinator garden with informational sign and bench. This garden is intentionally close to Haslett Road for visibility, enjoyment, and education! Other areas of the north side still need attention, but much progress has been made! And the east side is currently on hold as we prepare for future changes in that area. So stay tuned!

WEEDING HELP: If you are willing to take on weeding one of the small garden plots this summer, **please be in touch with Kelly Flagg**. Call or text: 517.256.8392.

What's Blooming in our Native Plantings? by Sally Garrod

Common Name:	Purple Prairie Clover
Scientific Name:	Dalea purpurea
Sun:	Full sun
Soil Moisture:	Medium to dry, well-drained
Height:	1-2 feet
Flower:	Thimble-shaped, purple dotted with gold anthers
Habitat:	Prairies, savannas & limestone glades
Bloom Time:	July - August
Benefits:	Pollen, nectar and seeds support Bumble- bees and other pollinators, birds
Larval Host:	Dogface Sulfur butterflies and Reakirt's Blue butterflies

<u>Fun Fact</u>: Plants in the genus Dalea are legumes. Most legumes host beneficial bacteria on their roots. These bacteria aid in the fixation of atmospheric nitrogen, improving the fertility of the soil.
