Fully Funding the Church We Love Update:

Of the 71 financial commitments we have received for 2023 by the due date of this article (Nov. 15, 2 Days after Commitment Sunday), we are about 72% to our goal. Here are some trends in Fully Funding the Church We Love:

- 39 commitments indicate increased financial investment in 2023 over 2022 18 are the same as in 2022
- 11 are new financial commitments (these are not part of the 39 increases)
- 3 are decreases to 2022

In 2022, we had 92 units that committed, and we reasonably expect that we have about 30 more pledging units yet to respond based on past trends. The Stewardship Team is following up! We aren't there yet, but we are moving in the right direction and will keep you updated! This year, bring any bird and squirrel friendly treat to decorate our outdoor tree and feed our furry friends!



String any fruit into a garland!

- ~Dried millet, dried sunflower heads, or other dried grains
- ~Strings of broken walnuts or peanuts
- ~Small birdseed muffins or cookies
- ~Strings of plain air-popped popcorn or an unsweetened cereal
- ~Cut shapes out of apple slices using a cookie cutter

You are welcome to come and decorate the tree at anytime during Advent!

ADULTS: Consider being one of our adult chaperones! If it is helpful to talk to past chaperones about what to expect, please reach out to Erin and she can make that happen!





HCC's annual participation in the CROP Hunger Walk is one of the highlights of our service to those in need in our community and country and around the world. On a sunny day -October 9 -

our 30+ walkers and your generosity raised \$9,035! Twenty-five percent of those funds are distributed locally, including some to the Haslett Community Food Pantry, Advent House, and Volunteers of America. The main beneficiaries are people around the world, where Church World Service provides food, medical care, disaster relief, and self-help development efforts. Churches throughout Lansing participated in the walk and contributed to making it a success, and HCC members Bob Purosky and Mary Trebilcock provided leadership for the Lansing Area Walk.

"Have You Noticed?" Advent Edition by Jenn Tafel

"Do You Hear What I Hear?" is one of my favorite songs during the season of Advent. The time leading up to celebrating Christmas is stress-inducing, noisy, chaotic, and honestly the antithesis of the intention behind Advent. The intentions of the season of Advent include waiting, anticipation, preparation, and expectancy. The question, "How am I creating space for Christ to enter my life?" may be a good starting point for the season.

I think this is why I resonate with the message of the song, "Do You Hear What I Hear?." The song calls for us to slow down, pay attention, and prepare for Christ. I encourage you to read the back story about the song and producer, Noël Regeney, if you haven't done so.

I share my reflections about this song and the season of Advent to encourage you to explore the worship space as it's undergone big changes as we are cultivating a way for the Christ child to enter our lives as a community. What have you noticed?

Questions to consider during the Advent season: Is baby Jesus in the manger on the altar (why/why not)? How many candles are in the Advent Wreath and when are they lit? What is an Advent Wreath? Will there be more than one star on the parament (altar/pulpit cloths)?

As the liturgical seasons* change during the year, the Spiritual Life Committee encourages you to keep exploring, asking questions, and preparing the way for Christ to enter into your life and the community.

*Liturgical seasons: The church year, also called liturgical year, annual cycle of seasons and days observed in the Christian churches in commemoration of the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and of his virtues as exhibited in the lives of the saints. The colors of the paraments as well as other traditions are ways to celebrate this in the church.
