Dear Haslett Community Church,

This is the time of year that stores know to woo shoppers with Black Friday, Christmas Door

buster, and end-of-year sales. So, forgive this very consumer sounding description of Advent:

Advent - your two-for-one season of preparation!

Yes, that description sounds a little too commercial. But it gets at the understanding that there are two connected but distinct purposes to this season. Most of us probably realize that we use the season of Advent to prepare for the birth of Jesus, God coming to live among us as humanity and divinity, to show the world God's love, the story of which we remember together on Christmas Eve and continue to celebrate on Christmas Day.

The other aspect of Advent is the recognition that we are always living in a time of expectation, preparing for the fullness of time when Christ returns and the world is at last reconciled and peaceful, when there is no more strife or struggle.

Quite frankly, it seems much more realistic to prepare for Christmas Day than to prepare for the new heaven and the new earth! Christmas comes but once a year and those things that help bring us to a time of reflection and appreciation can all be part of Advent and preparing to welcome the Christ child. From decorating our homes and our church, to music we only sing during this precious month, to lighting Advent candles and opening Advent calendars, to the special worship services and visits to our living Advent Tree to hang something edible for our feathered and furry friends – all of this helps prepare us for Christmas morning, and celebrating the birth of Christ.

As for the less easy to address aspect of Advent – take heart! The truth is that we prepare for, and take part in, reconciling the world to

God each time we love our neighbor, care for the community, worship and fellowship together, pray, seek justice, love mercy, walk humbly ... you get the idea! Preparing for Christmas and celebrating Christ's birth is a month. Living into Christ's redemptive work that is not yet complete is something we strive for all the time. And so, we keep our minds and hearts open to ways we are being called to share love in this world ... and feel OK knowing that making that favorite cookie recipe and stuffing that stocking is part of Advent, too.

- Week 1 Scripture – Psalm 25: 1-10, Jeremiah 33: 10-11 Joyful Offering goes to the UCC Christmas Fund
- **Week 2 Songfest** is a celebration of music of the season, and this year the HCC Choir will be joined by guest musicians to bring us pieces from Handel's Messiah! We will also sing some seasonal music together as the Sanctuary is transformed into an inviting dining room, with pastries for all (including gluten free, nut free, and vegan options), coffee and punch.
- Week 3 Scripture Luke 1: 39-55 This is the only "typical" worship service for all of Advent. Join us.
- Week 4 and Christmas Eve It is unusual for the 4th Sunday of Advent to fall on Christmas Eve! The result is that we recognize the 4th Sunday of Advent in the morning, with our Christmas Eve services at night.
 - 10 a.m. The Children's Christmas Service is designed with Children in mind, but is a time for all to worship. We will have music by some of our young musicians, an interactive children's story, and familiar elements of worship.
- 7 p.m. & 9 p.m. Candlelight Christmas Eve Services at both times are nearly identical, but with a Children's Moment at 7 p.m. Both services end with "Silent Night" by candlelight.

The tree is once again generously donated by Dave and Nancy Ferguson. Thank you to all for this wonderful addition to our tradition!





CURRENT NEEDS: 1. We still need people to offer to purchase gifts (see HOW below).

WHAT: The project offers five gifts (mostly clothing) to each child. Donors will receive a gift list that shows all gifts for a single child. You can select any number of children.

You can request a gift list remotely: Send an email with "Gift Request" in the Subject line to hccChristmas@att.net. Put three things in your email:

- 1) your name and phone number
- 2) the number of children you wish to sponsor (remember, you will be responsible for five gifts for each child you request)
- 3) your preference of the child's age: 0 to 5; 6 to 12; or 13 to 18. You can include a gender preference, but that is not required.

You will receive a gift list and gift preparation instructions via return email. We will do our best to match your preferences. You can pick up a gift list in person from the gift table in Friendship Hall any Sunday morning after worship or Saturday mornings from 11am to noon.




