2021 Stewardship Campaign Report

The 2021 "Imagine Abundance" stewardship campaign has concluded, and we want to thank those who pledged!

For 2021, we received 92 pledges totaling \$257,562. Twenty-nine of the pledges were increases from last year (net gain of \$8,454); six pledges were decreases (net loss of \$5,700); sixteen pledges did not renew (net loss of \$11,870); fifty pledges stayed the same as in 2020; and we received seven new pledges (net gain of \$13,300).

God loves us · Philanthropy begins with God's love for us.

We accept God's love · Love is a gift to be accepted and received.

We love God in return · Love is relational, as by nature and by God's grace we are belongers, born into God's family.

We form community with God · In the community of God's family we share life together, and we share in responsibility of the community.

We cooperate with God · Love for God leads us to participate in God's generosity toward others.

Haslett Community Church, United Church of Christ, participates in God's generosity toward others in many ways including: giving to scholarship funds for UCC institutions of higher learning, and by giving a percentage of our pledged income to Our Church's Wider Mission, or OCWM, which supports local, statewide, national, and global ministries connected to our denomination.
