It's a brand new year, Haslett Community Church! and also...

It may feel a lot like yesterday, Haslett Community Church!

I'm just going to say it:

The New Year is rather inconveniently timed.

It's the middle of winter, the middle of the school year for families whose lives are affected by that calendar, and the middle of the program year for churches. There also tends to be this pressure to choose a short or long list of resolutions that you will start on RIGHT NOW even if the bleak midwinter is more a time for snuggling in, slowing down, and just doing what it is possible to do with short days (though they are getting longer now) and what can be dangerous driving conditions.

The New Year, from a church or worship calendar standpoint, actually already came and went. The "liturgical" new year was November 27, 2022 ... the First Sunday of Advent. So, if you're not feeling like making all things new this January, the pressure is off!

On the other hand, you may be feeling like casting off 2022 is exactly what you need right now, like entering a new year will be like shedding a skin that no longer fits. Embrace that! It IS a new year, after all. Make it what you want it to be!

The Apostle Paul wrote, "...we are being renewed, *day by day*" (2 Corinthians 4:16). T.S. Eliot took that further by writing, "*Every moment* is a fresh beginning" (emphasis mine in both quotes). Yes, God is continually making all things new, be that every year, day by day, or every moment. And that is amazing.

Maybe you feel that with each new year, or each sunrise, or with each blink of an eye, you have a new opportunity. And maybe you don't.

The good news is not that a ball drops in Times Square offering us some new chance; the good news is that whether things feel new in every new year or new moment or not ... God is with us in EVERY moment. Old and new, yesterday and today and tomorrow, forevermore. The pressure is off to improve yourself or your life in the way New Year's Resolution culture would ask you to. Let the love of God, the life of Christ, and the presence of the Spirit transform you. And might our Triune God of Grace continually shape Haslett Community Church, United Church of Christ to be a helpful, healthy participant to the transformation.


# Song of Welcome A Refugee Development Center Fundraiser

Sunday, January 8<sup>th</sup> is a Communion Sunday, which means our children are in worship for the entire service. As a way of including them in the service, and to give them a time to be more active, they will collect their Joyful Offering.

In the past, our Joyful Offering has gone to support the child we sponsor through World Vision. The child, Salima, we sponsored for over 10 years has "graduated" out of the World Vision program. Her graduation gives us the opportunity to use our Joyful Offering in new ways!

For 2023, each time we collect our Joyful Offering (on Communion Sundays), it will go to support a different organization, ministry, or nonprofit. This will give our children and our congregation the opportunity to learn about many different organizations that are doing important work in our world! In January, our Joyful Offering will go to support Heifer International!



Heifer International is a global nonprofit working to eradicate poverty and hunger through sustainable, valuesbased holistic community development. They distribute animals, along with agricultural and values-based training, to families in need around the world as a means of providing selfsufficiency.

For \$20 we can donate a flock of chicks. For \$120 we can donate a goat or a sheep. \$150 buys an alpaca for a family. \$300 gives the gift of clean water.




25<sup>th</sup> Annual HCC Ski Trip

The Social Committee is excited to be hosting the HCC 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Ski Trip this weekend (Jan. 5-8)!




