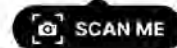
Pastor Betsy will be on vacation and unavailable July 1-July 12, 2022. For Pastoral emergencies during that time, please be in touch with Pastor Erin.

Michigan Pride Rally at the Capitol

June is National Pride month! Pride is celebrated annually to honor the 1969 uprising at the Stonewall Inn in NYC, which started a movement for gay rights. Pride works to achieve equal justice and equal opportunity for those who are Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer / Questioning+.

As an Open & Affirming Congregation that fully affirms and welcomes LGBTQ+ people, Haslett Community Church has participated in Michigan Pride events over the years. However, like many other things, Pride events have been on hold for two years. **This year, Michigan Pride is back with a Rally at the Capitol on Sunday, June 26, Noon - 2pm!**

Mask News:

On May 10, your church Council voted unanimously to update masking guidelines for the time being. The new policy which went into effect immediately, is as follows:

NEW and Improved Confirmation

Over the last several years, it's gotten more and more difficult to find times when students are available to participate in a confirmation class.

This scheduling challenge inspired us to take a look at how we do things and led us to make some changes.

This summer we are kicking-off a new confirmation process. With any change, we expect there to be some bumps along the way, and we may find the need for mid-journey changes.

We welcome any feedback that our students and their families might offer as they go through the process.

The new program will be shared with youth families in greater detail, but here are some program highlights:

Family Component:

Students and their families will watch selected videos from re:form (by Sparkhouse) that wrestle with some of the basic questions of our faith. A discussion guide will be shared with families as well. Erin has DVDs available for anyone who is interested in seeing them.

Mentor:

Each student will be paired with a mentor. Together they will read through one of the gospels and will complete a Resurrection Project (fixing something that is broken, or repurposing something to give it "new life").

Getting to know HCC:

Students will be invited to explore all the ways that people are involved with Haslett Community Church. From serving on committees, helping on Sunday morning in various roles, etc.

Faith Statement:

Each student, will work with Erin to create some type of faith statement capturing where they are at the end of Confirmation.

Students are invited to embark on their journey whenever they feel ready. A family, for example, might find it easiest to have more than one student go through this at the same time (so they're all learning together). And there is no set timeline for how soon they must complete all the tasks. Some students may get through it in a few months, while others might take over a year. The hope is that students will find this new program accessible and easy to incorporate into their lives- which hopefully will then carryover into finding time and space for church, faith, etc to be a continued part of their life following confirmation.

To begin, families just need to talk to Erin. A two-week heads up is appreciated to get supplies prepped and a mentor secured.

Keep an eye out for parent emails and Remind messages sharing details about YOUTH GROUP SUMMER FUN! We aren't meeting on Sunday evenings but will plan a few summer get-togethers!



We are counting down the days til we depart on HCC's 26th mission trip to Milwaukee!

At this point, all families should be paid in full, unless other arrangements were made with Pastor Erin.

Please mark your calendars for these important dates:

Plan on coming to one of two TRIP MEETINGS specifically for parents, guardians, adults who have students going on the trip on Tuesday, May 31st OR Monday, June 6th at HCC at 7pm. Chaperones and halferones are also asked to attend one of these meetings. Youth are also welcome to attend the meetings for information about the trip, but a parent/guardian/adult is required to attend to fill out trip forms, etc.

Mission trip participants (youth, chaperones and halferones) are asked to attend two pre-trip meetings on June 14th and 16th from 7-8:30pm. These meetings help us learn more about the community in which we will be serving as well as help us bond as a group.

All of HCC is invited to pray for the mission trippers while we serve in Milwaukee. We look forward to sharing our trip with you on Mission Trip Sunday, Sunday, June 26th!

Ageing On Our Own Terms

- Nancy and Paul White

Earlier this year, Pastor Betsy asked us to help put together an opportunity for members of our church family who, like us, are either nearing or are in our retirement years, or who may have parents or family members who are reaching their “golden years.”

The plan for this series is to provide an opportunity for interested members of our church family to:

- (1) learn about the physical and mental changes related to ageing,
- (2) how to maintain desired activities and interests, including *Independence*, *Privacy*, and *Empowerment* in decision making, including medical and end of life situations, and
- (3) to possibly develop an ongoing common interest/mutual support group within our church family.

The series will address three topics over the course of four months, with three newsletter articles, one per month, on one of the topics. The fourth month will offer a facilitated discussion group, probably on two different dates and times.

Part One - Physical and mental changes (June newsletter)

This includes an overview of normal changes that affect just about everyone, such as deteriorating vision or hearing, cognitive health changes, etc., as well as common individually specific conditions such as Alzheimer’s, Parkinson’s, osteoporosis, diabetes, mental health/depression, malnutrition, physical disabilities, etc.

Part Two - Legal challenges of ageing (July newsletter)

This includes an overview of difficulties seniors face in managing their own health care, and options to help manage these challenges, such as a durable medical power of attorney, an advance care directive, and controlling end of life decisions.

Part Three - Residential challenges and choices (August newsletter)

This includes an overview of the difficulties of staying in one’s home as we age. It will look at “ageing in place” and ways to facilitate staying in one’s home, including home modifications and in-home assistance. It will review options when “ageing in place” is not reasonable, such as, independent and assisted living facilities, group homes, nursing homes, etc.

Part Four - Facilitated group discussion including personal experiences and questions (September)

This will include at least two opportunities for anyone interested in discussing these topics to get together for an hour or so as a group. We expect to have at least one discussion following a September worship service, and one discussion on a weekday evening.



This is the first of three topics which will be part of the **Ageing Our Own Terms** series. The hope is that the information serves as food for thought and that those thoughts will be shared during the facilitated discussion that will take place in September.

Part One: Physical and Mental Changes

We are born, we grow to physical and mental maturity, and then we begin to age. Our body begins to age at 30, or even earlier. For example, the brain begins to age at 24. The lungs begin at 35, kidneys at 35, muscle mass and bone density loss at 40. Age 65 is when the soft tissues of the voice box weaken causing our voices to change. Women's voices may get lower, and men's voices may get higher. The liver is the only organ that seems to defy the ageing process. It typically does not start to deteriorate until the age of 70.

Typically, many of us start to lose our hearing when we are in our 40s. Almost half the people in the United States over the age of 65 have some degree of hearing loss.

Our vision begins changing around 40 because the lens inside the eye begins to lose its ability to change shape.

As the brain ages it shrinks. At age 30 it weighs 3 pounds and barely fits inside the skull. By age 70 there is about one inch of space between the brain and the skull. The earliest portions to shrink are generally the frontal lobes, which govern judgment and planning, and the hippocampus where memory is organized.

The natural curvature of the spine changes with ageing. This causes the head to tip forward, so when you are looking straight ahead you are actually looking upward. This can contribute to increased difficulty breathing and swallowing and increases the risk of choking.

Another significant risk of aging is the risk of falling. Three factors for falling are: (1) poor balance, (2) taking more than four prescription medications and (3) muscle weakness. Elderly people who do not have these risk factors still have a 12% chance of falling in a year. *Those with all three have almost a 100% chance.* Falls often result in fractures, primarily to the hip. About 350,000 Americans incur a fractured hip each year. Forty percent of these patients end up in a nursing home and 20 percent are never able to walk again. Along with fractures, a major risk of falling is cerebral bleeding after a blow to the head.

We have experienced some of these changes ourselves. We have witnessed them in our parents, siblings, and friends. These changes often contribute to conditions such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, and other dementia, as well as osteoporosis, diabetes, depression, malnutrition, etc.

While ageing does have its challenges, education helps so we know what to expect for ourselves and our loved ones. Part of what we learn is that no matter what age we are or what physiological changes we experience, we are not alone. There are resources and people that can help. As we progress through this series as a church family, we will continue to share resources and find support in community to help on our life journeys.
