"And the Spirit immediately drove Jesus out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him." -Mark 1: 12-13

Haslett Community Church will provide in person and remote options throughout Lent that are designed to help us feel a sense of connectedness to self, others, and God. You will find the details within this newsletter.

If you have gotten out of the habit of participating in worship and other programs offered at Haslett Community Church, allow Lent to be an opening for your re-entry to the life, friendship, challenge, and spiritual growth that HCC

fosters as we strive joyfully and prayerfully to warmly welcome all, freely share our blessings, and humbly explore God's love! We are journeying toward Easter together. And while every Easter is indeed reason to celebrate, this will be our first Easter in 3 years in which we can be together, and my FIRST Easter with you where in person worship is offered!

### **LENT BEGINS** with **Ash Wednesday on March 2**.

Lent is a six-and-a-half-week season of preparation for the highest holy day on the Christian calendar: Easter Sunday (April 17)! Lent invites us to turn away from things that distract us from the divine, or to consider practices that open us to the divine. The length of Lent is 40 days (not counting Sundays) because of Jesus' time in the wilderness.

This year, during the season of Lent, we will be partnering with Edgewood United Church, UCC in East Lansing around the theme of water. Our Lent program is THIRSTING: A Journey of Wisdom and Water in the Wilderness. We will explore scriptural narratives around water, recognize the holy nature of water as it is connected to life and baptism, and do some learning about the challenges of water as a valuable resource today. We will even offer opportunities to learn from those who have first-hand knowledge of the Flint Water Crisis and more.

Our full Lenten schedule and resource guide for THIRSTING: A Journey of Wisdom and Water in the Wilderness is attached to this email /mailing.



The creators of this devotional describe it this way:

"Our theme for this devotional is "God is Still With Us." As we journey through the season of Lent together, you are invited to remember that from the foundations of the world, the Holy Spirit hovered over creation. The Spirit hovers, even now. When God's people seemed abandoned in Egypt, God guided them into the Promised Land. God guides us, even now. In the birth of Jesus—Immanuel—God was with us. And God is still with us, even now.

The life of Jesus shows us that God joins us in our human struggles. God does not avoid our messy lives or withdraw from our hard stories. As we

live in different times, in different places, we know that we are not alone. Even in this very moment, God is as close as the breath we breathe. This Lent, we will explore Gospel passages that remind us that God is still with us. The good news of the gospel is that Jesus experienced the fullness of humanity—comfort and pain, celebration and heartache, and joy and suffering. And when he had the choice to escape ridicule or rejection, Jesus stuck with the outsiders, the oppressed, and the hurting.

The life of Jesus demonstrates that God knows what it is to be human and to be with us in all our experiences, especially in our suffering. We encourage you to explore how these ideas and themes influence how you view God, your faith, and the world."

### The Topic We Are All Tired Of: MASKS

In mid-February, Ingham County and Michigan health department leaders suddenly dropped their recommendation that schools and many other indoor settings should require masks. At this time, Haslett Community Church will continue requiring masks in the building because:

- 1. Transmission rates in Ingham County are still in the "High" range. Categories are: High, Substantial, Moderate, Low.
- 2. At the time of writing, both Sparrow Hospital and McLaren Hospital are > 90% capacity.
- Some of our families have children under the age of five (who are unable to receive the COVID vaccine), and some worshipers are immunocompromised themselves or have individuals in their family who are high-risk.
- 4. We are still in the winter months that do not allow for wide open windows and maximized air circulation. We know that air circulation is

an important mitigation strategy that can be better used in the warmer months.

As you can probably guess, making health & safety decisions is not the reason I felt called to ministry. I don't say that for sympathy, but rather to acknowledge: most are weary of hearing about health and safety decisions, most are weary of making health and safety decisions. I am with you in your weariness. Some will be glad to hear we are still requiring masks. Others will be disappointed or upset. We are together in wanting to move forward. I am here, and your church Council is here to listen to your ideas, support, and frustration. Your church Council will continue to discuss and make decisions together. This has been a long journey, and you all have been wonderful companions. Let's keep communication open so we can keep walking with each other. Thank you.

### Why Are We Still Using Zoom?

Now that in-person worship is no longer paused as an option and many groups, committees, and meetings are happening in person, some are wondering: what's up with the continued Zoom programs?

As you can imagine, there is no one answer to this question, but here are some reasons we continue to utilize Zoom:

- Sometimes, it's just out of sheer convenience. A Zoom meeting can go on no matter the
  weather, it removes travel time for attendees, and folks can attend from the comfort of
  their own homes without going out in the cold (particularly important this time of year).
- Believe it or not, Zoom can be, for some purposes, MORE conducive to connecting and sharing than traditional meetings. Just the other day, I spoke to a regular attendee of the Men's Group, who said the Zoom format was perfect, because everyone was involved, engaged, and able to talk to and hear from the whole group.
- Some programs, like Wednesday evening Brown Bags & Beliefs, has been offered in person, hybrid (Zoom and in person), and Zoom only. Our best attendance has been with the Zoom only options which allows for all participants to have a shared experience and enjoy any videos or visuals that are shared.
- There are some members of our church community who have to be extremely cautious due to health reasons, or are not yet comfortable with in person gatherings. Zoom is accessible to those folks.

If there is a program, meeting, or other offering you are interested in, but think the experience will be diminished by it occurring via Zoom, give it a try. You may be surprised at how connection is possible, even through remote means.



is a collaborative series of worship and programming around the importance of water and water justice in Scripture and the world.

### We welcome you to Worship with us!

In the spirit of inclusivity and welcoming, we offer three ways for you to worship with us:



- 1. <u>In person in the Sanctuary</u> There are some ways we are lowering risks as we gather inside to keep our community safer:
  - Currently, masks are required in the building, this includes during worship as we have young worshippers who cannot be vaccinated, and worshippers in higher risk categories.
  - Chairs are spaced out, and you can put an open seat holder on either side of your household to keep some distance.
  - Bulletins are distributed on paper and electronically if you prefer.
  - Please worship remotely if you answer 'yes' to any of the questions on the health checklist below.
- 2. <u>In the Parking Lot via radio</u> Want to be present at church, but you aren't quite ready to come in side? Join us in the parking lot!
  - Park near the sanctuary (south side is best), turn your radio to 88.7 FM, and turn up the
    volume. You will hear everything that our sound system picks up, and we can wave to you

- 3. <u>Remote via Livestream</u> Continue to find the service each Sunday morning at haslettcommunitychurch.org or on our YouTube channel. You can find the bulletin online **HERE**.


