"This is a day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it ." - Psalm 118:24

I remember an experience over 20 years ago, when I was a "newish" Christian and just starting to volunteer as a leader with my church's youth group; I was at a youth ministry workshop and the ice breaker was to tell everyone what your favorite scripture passage was. I didn't have a favorite scripture passage. I did-

n't yet know enough about the Bible to pick something that was my favorite. I didn't have any scripture memorized. I was just trying to read and learn and worship. No one told me I was also supposed to memorize things!

Thankfully, I had purchased a bookmark at the Christian bookstore the year or so prior to this event when I also bought my first Bible, on the same day I was baptized. And the bookmark had Psalm 118:24 printed on it. So I knew it. And under pressure I claimed it to be my favorite passage. Must have been a good choice. The workshop attendees all nodded and "uhhuh"ed in approval. No one suspected it was the only passage I could recite on command.

Truth be told, I'm still not one to memorize the Bible (although I'm certainly much more familiar with it than I was 20+ years ago). And I don't actually have a favorite verse.

What I DO have, are favorite expressions of faith, and favorite threads woven throughout the grand story told in scripture of the relationships between God, humanity, and creation. And something I love about Haslett Community Church, United Church of

Christ, is that time and again, your expressions of faith are wonderful. Sometimes we express our faith in worship, sometimes in questions and doubts, sometimes in participation in programs or groups, sometimes sharing a meal together, sometimes disagreeing with each other, sometimes in giving back to the church with our time and talent and treasure, sometimes in gathering for celebration or mourning. And a thousand other ways.

With no disrespect to Psalm 118:24, if someone were to ask me now what my favorite Bible verse is, I would have the confidence and presence to say that I don't have a favorite (or a least favorite). But, that my favorite expression of scripture is a church that can explore and love and wrestle with faith together in communities that care for God, each other, and creation. Communities like Haslett Community Church.

Beloveds, there is so much good happening within these walls, and beyond them by this community's expressions of faith in church and world. I hope you will join us, or continue to join us, in being part of it!

HCC Green Team and partners celebrate SSCC "Green Energy Switch-On"

houses of worship in the Lansing area that combined our "green teams" to form the Capital Area Chapter of Michigan Interfaith Power and Light. Members include All Saints Episcopal Church (East Lansing), Congregation Kehillat Israel (Lansing), Edgewood United Church (East Lansing), Faith Lutheran Church (Okemos), First Presbyterian Church of Lansing, Haslett Community Church, the Islamic Center of East Lansing, Presbyterian Church of Okemos, Unitarian Universalist Church of Greater Lansing, and University Lutheran Church (East Lansing).

A common thread in our religious experiences is the concern for Creation, including the natural world and humankind. As shown by last summer's catastrophic floods, we know that climate change is already impacting people, especially communities of color.

On April 23, the chapter celebrated the successful completion of its first project at the "Green Energy Switch-On" at the South Side Community Coalition (SSCC) community center at 2101 W. Holmes in Lansing. This project is a perfect example of how teamwork can accomplish environmental and social justice goals that are otherwise beyond our reach.

For two decades, the SSCC has provided important services for young people, seniors, and families, including recreational, educational, and nutritional programs. Last year they served about 225 low-income families and individuals in this part of Lansing. Part of their mission is connecting families with a healthy environment, and the board realized that moving to renewable energy by producing their own solar power would help the planet and save thousands of dollars a year in utility costs, freeing up more money for their programs. But the \$35,000 project cost seemed beyond the center's budget.

Several of the member houses of worship (including HCC) had recent experience with rooftop solar, and the chapter decided to work together with SSCC to help them realize their dream to promote clean energy and climate equity. With financial support from the entire group, including congregational and individual contributions, the funding goal was achieved in a few months. The local firm Absolute Solar installed the 13 kilowatt system, and the South Side Community Center is now running on 100% solar energy. This is good for the planet, and shows that all communities can benefit from our transition to a renewable future.

By working together, we accomplished something that benefits both our community and the earth—something we couldn't have done as individuals or single congregations. We've also had a wonderful opportunity to learn from each other and find out what our congregations share in common. Just a reminder that all adults who volunteer with our children's ministry are asked to complete our online Safe Church Training. That training can be found HERE!




This summer, in Sunday school our children will be exploring the Promises of God that we find in Scripture.




