Dear Haslett Community Church,

We are entering a season of gratitude and thanksgiving! Many of the letters to churches

found in the New Testament were written by Paul, the apostle, who loved to start his letters with gratitude. It is a good way to begin!

As we continue in our efforts to Fully Fund the Church We Love, I want to thank you for your commitment to Haslett Community Church, United Church of Christ. I thank God for the ways you have shown your love for this church that you love, through your presence (in person or remotely), through the images and words you've shared on our collaborative art piece in the Sanctuary, through the hours of volunteer work contributed, through your friendly smiles and acts of compassion, and through your financial contributions. By God's grace, you are the church!

Investing in what we love matters. And whether you are new to HCC or a longtime part of this community, you are being invited to invest, perhaps for the first time, in the ministry and mission of sharing God's love for creation, community, and you, so we can be sure to sustain this church out of respect for those who have come before us, for the present, and for future generations!

To allow giving to catch up to our need, we are taking a pause on the budgeting process in 2023. Aside from a 2% increase in staff salaries aside from mine, no budgets are being increased in the coming year, in spite of inflation (including my salary). The goal in Fully Funding the Church We Love is to do just that; to have a Sustainable, balanced budget in 2023. The good news is that

small, incremental increases by those who can add the price of a cup of coffee or lunch out per week to their giving, and by adding new and returning regular givers to our rolls, we can reach our goal. Together, the distance between where we are and where we need to be doesn't seem far – it is reachable!

Commitment Sunday is November 13. Please bring your bright green pledge card to church, or mail it in, or communicate your financial commitment via email to hccfinance@att.net on or before this day, so that Council can plan for our Congregational Budget Meeting in January. Mailings went out at the end of October.

Just as gratitude is a good place to begin, it is also a good place to end. I thank God that you are part of Haslett Community Church and the love that is shared with the world through this place.

Sunday morning coffee thoughts...a longer read, but one I feel compelled to share this morning.

Last week we were the church coffee hosts, which depending on our mood floats between afternoon tea with friends to full scale dessert catering operation for 100 guests. This is a reg-

ular gig for us and last week we were definitely in go mode. I was searching through the cupboards looking for dessert plates and muttered to Karla...

"This church has everything you need, you just have to know where to look to find it."

We are just past our 23rd year in the Haslett Community Church and it's weird that we've gone from young couple to church standards. From weddings to committees, funerals and baptisms, we've walked nearly every corridor of church life. It's important too to remember that for us, everything we are doing was built by those before us; it's simply our turn to take care of it. Sure we change with the times but traditions are key, including a long standing service of coffee hosts. I KNEW that those dessert plates were somewhere, and as I pounded through drawer and cupboard I realized what I'd said so flippantly meant so much more.



What was it exactly that I needed from the church and where was it? I've turned to the church in times of joy and crisis, comfort and celebration, but thinking back on it, our greatest time of need was not a signature event but a small moment in time where we were weakest.

Years ago our young family stumbled into church a few minutes later than normal and we had to sit on the other side of church. No, we do not have assigned seating but we all sit in the same spots anyway because that's just how it is. You sit down once and that's your section for life!

So we had to sit in a different section that day, which was fine. The church nursery was closed that morning for communion and we had a very happy but fussy few month old Lillian in her cradle carrier, and a very antsy and animated 20ish month old Lee on our hip, and we were not winning. We tried so hard to be invisible but we were a mess.

We had two babies, which is enough for anyone. But we'd also been taking care of Karla's mom who was losing her fight against cancer. Meals, medicine, surgeries, hospital stays, never ending appointments, heartbreak and the bleak walk of an

I remember shuffling Lily from hip

to hip as Karla let Lee purse surf when I felt a tap on my shoulder. I turned around and one of our church mentors was standing with arms outstretched and a look on his face that said, give me the baby. At first I said no, we were okay...but we weren't okay. We were broken and tired and sad and hopeless and worn down and lost. And in a moment of acceptance I handed Lily back.

After a guick minute I realized it was my burden to bear and not wanting to over extend the invitation, I turned to take her back. But she wasn't there. She was with someone different a few seats over. Every few moments I looked to take her back but she was further and further away. Our baby daughter was traveling through the back rows of the church and at one point she crossed the aisle!

Now I have no idea what negotiations were happening between the people of the back rows that would declare "you've had enough time with her, hand her over" but at some point I just gave up looking back. Lee had settled down drawing and I realized for the first time in forever nothing was needed of us.

Instead I just sat there with Karla. We listened to the sermon in peace, we sang together and for the first time in forever we were allowed to focus inward and not outward. By the time the last hymns were being sung I felt a tap on my shoulder and Lillian was given back to us.

I tell this story because what we were given that day was something so defining it set us on a course that we are still walking down these many years later. I left service that day with joy, and warmth, and most importantly hope and peace. I had an energy and spirit that was renewed.

Dare I say, I felt reborn.

This church has everything you need, you just have to know where to look to find it... Or more specifically in your darkest moments it will find you.

Your Prayer Chain Questions Answered!

Council News

At the regular monthly Church Council Meeting in October, an addendum to the Haslett Community Church Bylaws, article II, section B.9: Services and Meetings, was proposed and adopted by vote. The addendum allows the 2022 Annual Congregational Meeting to move from December 2022 to January 2023. This moves our budget conversation out of the middle of the season of Advent, and puts us more in the standard practice of other churches with fiscal years that align with the calendar year. An amendment to the bylaws will be addressed at the November Council meeting. An amendment must be communicated to and voted on by the Congregation, so you will see more information following the next Council meeting.

Nominating Committee, chaired by Pat Dalton, is accepting Nominees for Council and other

leadership positions in the church. If you would like to nominate yourself or someone else as a Council Member or leadership/officer, please contact Pat Dalton at acme50@comcast.net.

One must be a member of the church to serve as a Council Member or Officer. For more information on open Council and other positions, please contact Malinda Barr, Moderator, at mailbar339@gmail.com [Council is the leadership board of the church, and the Moderator is the chair of the Council].

Due to the church being used for elections on November 8, the November Council meeting will take place on November 15, 2022, at 7:15 p.m., one week later than usual.

Council meetings are open, and while visitors cannot vote, there is a time to make public comment.


Hanging of the Greens


You are invited to join in on preparing our church for Advent. Hanging of the Greens will be on Sunday, November 27, at 4:00 pm. We will

Sermon Preview Bible Study Thursdays 9-9:45 a.m. Via Zoom




Join Pastor Betsy for a weekly Bible Study based on the Scripture passages for the upcoming Sunday sermon.

WHAT: The project offers five gifts to each child. Donors will receive a gift list that shows all gifts for a single child. We ask one person to register for the child even if you decide to share the gift purchasing for that child with a family member or friend. You can select any number of children.

HOW: You can make a request remotely by sending an email with Gift Request in the Subject line to: hccChristmas@att.net

Put three things in your email:

- 1) your name and phone number
- 2) **the number of children** you wish to sponsor (remember, you will be responsible for five gifts for each child you request)
- 3) your preference of the child's age:
 0 to 5 years old; 6 to 12 years old; or
 13 to 18 years old. You can include a gender preference, but that is not required.

You will receive a gift list and gift preparation instructions via return email. We will do our best to match your preferences. The gift list will be sent out beginning November 14.

You can pick up a gift list in person from the gift table in Friendship Hall any Sunday morning after worship, beginning November 13, or Saturday mornings from 11am to noon, beginning November 19.

You are encouraged to take your used items to St. Vincent DePaul, who anticipates serving 600 refugees within the next year. A list of needed items is available at the following link:


