### **Fully Funding the Church We Love**

Pastor Betsy has kicked off this year by reminding us of all the things we love about HCC. But with a twist--by reminding us of the things that the church loves. This is what really draws us in, I think.

- The church's love of *our community* and the connections it brings.
- The church's love of *creation* and protecting God's creation.
- The church's love of *service* through the Food Bank, Youth Group, CROP Hunger Walk, and so much more.
- The church's love of *God*, the rock upon which our faith stands.
- The church's love of *you* and me; we are worthy of receiving love incarnate, made known to us as Jesus, and sharing love with others.

I come to you as Chair of Stewardship at HCC with a desire to give back to the place that has given so much love to me and my family. To return love with love--and commitment. But also, because I know a few things about raising funds, from my non-profit work. You want to see both passion and results. I think HCC has both to offer.

How do we sustain the church's love? That's the question every year about this time as we enter a season of giving. But it has an added urgency this year because of the church's difficult financial situation. As you may remember, the church passed a deficit budget last year, and we expected to end the year with a fund balance decrease of about \$24,000. However, due to the summer lag in pledged giving, and less non-pledged giving than expected, our fund balance has decreased by more than twice the projected amount. This isn't a crisis, but it isn't healthy either.

We recognize that the church requires our support to continue bringing love to our community through a healthy theology that is inviting, affirming, and welcoming.

This year, we seek to **Fully Fund the Church We Love**. By giving generously, we are enabling the church to realize its mission. The church requires our support to bring God's love into our lives and into the lives of our community, including the lives of youth in our community. The church requires our support to preserve our planet for future generations.

Stewardship is about how we care for what we have, both as individuals and as a community. We ask that you set aside a small period of time to intentionally consider how HCC has brought love into your life, and what it means to extend that love to others. The value of our offerings is in each of us doing our own part, as faithfully as we know how, and together, we find plenty. We trust and hope that together we can fully fund the church we love in 2023.

Dear Haslett Community Church,

As part of our continued learning around our lived mission in the community and the world, the whole congregation is being invited to participate in an art installation that will hang in our Sanctuary! 


# Sunday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> CORN MAZE & TRAIL OF TERROR 6pm

grow in our spiritual life, as well as foster closer ties between us.




