And... your presence and spirit in this place is valuable, no one can replace you, and we are a better community with you and because of you.

One thing we can probably all agree on is that our world needs more compassion. So this fall, in Sunday school, our children will be learning all about compassion. mportant Reminders

Youth are ALWAYS welcome to invite & bring friends to youth group and our various events. Some of our activities require signing up in advance (so we can be sure that we have enough room in cars, etc).

We have a Safe Church Policy focused on keeping our youth and children as safe as possible while they are at HCC (or attending off-site events with youth group). The policy does not allow youth to drive other youth during youth group events. Obviously, they can drive to/from events, but for example, a road rally would require an over 21 driver. So there will be times we ask parents/adults to sign up to help in this way.

For safety reasons, we require having a second adult in the building during youth group. This adult stays upstairs, near the unlocked door to monitor if folks are entering the building while youth group meets in the basement. Sign up for Security <u>HERE!</u>

We ask middle school families to bring a snack to youth group 1-2 times during the year. High school families, we ask you to bring dinner for youth group 1-2 times during the year. Families can team up for this if they choose. Sign up to bring food HERE!

It has been said, that the only guarantees in life are death and taxes. And out of these two things that we will all experience, we are much more likely to talk about taxes. Let's change that. We are mortal. We will die. So, let's talk about death in a supportive, safe, and faithful way. Pastor Betsy will lead a 5-week Wednesday Wisdom and Wondering Series called, **"Mortal and Marvelous: Real Talk About Dying,"** beginning at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 13. This series is relevant for adults of any age and stage in life. The weekly topics are expected to be:

September 13: **Death Café** – snacks provided as we have a guided, but very open and participant-led discussion about death, while enjoying treats. Some of what comes up tonight, may shape/change topics of subsequent weeks.

September 20: **Leaving Behind "Left Behind"** – In the early 2000's, actor Kirk Cameron helped propel some wildly popular books to the big screen. But the "Left Behind" series is based on very sketchy Biblical interpretation. So, what do we think happens after we die? And what does Scripture and our faith traditions tell us?

September 27: **Hospice, A Closer Look** – I was struck, several years ago, when a congregant was confiding in me that the reason they had resisted Hospice care is because "they make people die." That's not an accurate statement, but it is probably an accurate representation of some misconceptions around hospice care. Let's crack open Hospice care and palliative care (and how they're different) and more.

October 4: **Conversations to Have Before You Die** - 90% of people say it is important to speak with their loved ones about end-of-life care, but less than 30% of people have had the conversation. We will help make the conversation easier by covering conversation starters and resources that can help.

October 11: **Reflection & Resources** – Using some publications by the United Church of Christ, we will end this series with some hopeful reflection and helpful resources for moving ahead. After all, before we die, we fully live in the light of God's love for us.
